#### Greene and Greene. 11 80 Guildhall Street

The Greene & Greene garden is a beautiful and unusual space to see in town centre office premises. It is a large garden nurtured since 1937 by the present firm of solicitors. Seating is available. Full of a variety of roses, colourful perennials, mixed shrubs and spring bulbs which creates interest all year round. Wheelchair access from St Andrew's Street South.

### United Reformed Church Whiting Street

Bedding plants and shrubs surrounding the carpark and church. Toilets available and open from 12. Indoor picnic, refreshments available. A good place to stop for a pit stop!



14 Enter via the side entrance to a tranguil walled courtyard garden with climbing roses, small beds, raised small pond and many potted plants.

#### 27 Church Walks




#### 21 College Street

The Guildhall Feoffment Trust, 17 College Square

An amazing traditional rose garden with four large corner beds, each containing two contrasting rose varieties, plus standard rose trees in each. In full bloom in June/July and make a beautiful colourful display, matching shades in each bed - a bright mass of shades from red, deep burgundy, pink, peach, white, yellow and coral. Raised beds of mixed shrubs and flowers. Wheelchair access with plenty of room with wide pathways and centre gravel viewing area. An attractive wooden gazebo, tables, chairs and parasols to take a rest in the peaceful setting and enjoy the refreshments on offer.

**36 Whiting Street** 

A delightful sunny walled courtyard garden with medium to high walls and lots of pots. Entrance at the rear through garage in Finsbury Place. Two steps into garden.

3 Finsbury Place, Off Whiting Street A stunning south facing courtvard with water feature and architectural planting.

4 Finsbury Place,

Off Whiting Street A small westerly facing garden established over the past four vears. Two interlocking circles of gravel mean no regimental straight lines. In the shady border next to an adjoining house are shadeloving plants such as ferns, hostas and hellebores. A Madame Alfred

Carriere rose, one of the few to thrive on a north facing wall, shares the wall with a prolific Clematis Montana. The opposite border gets the sun in the afternoon and here there is more colour - tulips, daffodils and fritillaria in spring, peonies, a Gloire de Dijon rose and other perennials as well as sweet peas and sweet williams. Bulbs and perennials grow in pots on the patio.

6 Finsbury Place, 22

Off Whiting Street A delightful small garden where a one way system will operate for visitors. All garden features are upcycled car boot sale finds. Garage sale in aid of hospice.

#### **Turret Close**,

23 24 Westgate Street

Entrance via side gate. Inhale the delights of a lavender walk and rose garden which includes a water feature and small woodland walk. A few steps and seating.

#### Theatre Royal, NEW Westgate Street

To celebrate their forthcoming production of Francis Hodoson Burnett's Secret Garden this summer, Theatre Royal are taking part in the Hidden Gardens for the first time and would be delighted to welcome you to their theatre garden. Accessed through the beautiful 200-year-old Regency building, sit for a while to enjoy a drink. snack or delicious Criterion Ice Cream from the Greene King sponsored bar. At intervals during the day, members of the Secret Garden cast will be performing short scenes from the play for your entertainment. The Box Office staff will be on hand to tell you more about upcoming productions and book tickets if you wish. Accessible toilets available.

#### St. Edmunds Hospital NEW St Mary's Square

A wide variety of shrubs and trees in the gardens around this private hospital with a pond feature and water-loving planting. A short walk to the old orchard with tables and chairs to enjoy a picnic under the branches of the apple trees.

#### 59 Southgate Street

Cottage style garden with mature trees, lawn, seating and a small pond. Wildlife areas and plenty of flowers and shrubs. Artist studio open at bottom of garden. Plants for sale. Entrance through narrow alleyway.

#### 2 Southgate Green NEW

A truly hidden garden with rare specimen trees, country garden roses and box heading to the front garden. To the rear is a garden which was redesigned eight years ago with lawn area and country garden planting which is maturing beautifully.

#### 6 Southgate Green

A wonderful town garden with an abundance of flowering shrubs, climbers and trees. A garden created for wildlife in the local area and also to attract new wildlife

from further afield with herbaceous borders and spaces for wild flowers, a pond and several log piles. Mature and newly planted trees shape the view of the garden. There is a swing for children and a drawn up nature trail to spark their interest. The garden is on multiple levels on the old site of St. Petronilla's Hospital from the 12th Century. There is plenty of seating available and all safety measures will be in place on the day. There will be some plants available for sale. Entrance is from the brown gate which is situated in Beech Rise - going up the lane from Southgate Green, it is on the lefthand side.

Tranquil and beautifully designed gardens with gravel garden, wild flower meadow, a cottage garden with metal sculptures and large green house. Well worth a visit.

114 Hardwick Lane NEW

Medium sized garden, landscaped Ŀ. initially by Knotcutts, with steps or a gentle slope for wheelchair access to lower level. A very large variety of plants and shrubs with a white colour palate in the rear garden. Some unusual plants. There is a central pond, a lawned area with retaining walls which enclose attractive flower and ornamental



grass borders. Plenty of bench seating available.

#### 115 Queens Road NFW

A beautiful 200ft long & 20ft wide garden, designed with the idea of a child's paint box of colour. Roses, poppies, dahlias and more with lots of recycled items and a recent pond, now full of wildlife, as is the whole garden. A haven for birdlife. Several places to sit, look and listen.

#### 43 Westley Road NEW


A garden for wildlife. Full of birds, bees and butterflies, and hedgehogs visiting every night. Dragonflies and newts are attracted by a natural swimming pond. A tranquil space for people to connect with nature. Well worth the walk.

## 34 114 Westley Road NEW

A secluded country garden with patio leading to a large area of lawn with trees, shrubs and flowering plants including roses and herbaceous borders to the sides. Behind a fence is another patio and shed which is used to catch the sun. but is more of a working area. There is a small summer house where refreshments will be served. Well worth the walk.
