Short-term boosts welcome, but your support remains vital.

The national conversation around hospice funding has never been louder. Last year, the financial strain on the sector was laid bare, and locally, we too felt the pressure when part of our commissioned funding was cut by the Norfolk and Waveney Integrated Care Board.

In response to the national crisis, the government pledged £100m to hospices—an important step, but one that only funds capital projects, not the core costs of delivering care. The government has released the first £25m, and we're pleased to receive an

allocation of £97,852. While we've had some success in securing statutory funding locally, the reality is that the cost of running our Hospice continues to increase.

That's why your support continues to be more important than ever. Every donation, every fundraiser, and every act of kindness helps.





72% of our funding comes from you - our supporters-raising an incredible £5.4m.

Campaign & important updates

In our October issue, we launched our 'Without' campaign which aimed to highlight both the local and national hospice funding crisis and the urgent need for sustainable income. Since then, we've faced challenges—just like the entire sector—but thanks to your support, we've also seen hope and progress.

Here's what happened:

Win Our Without campaign and Hospice Care Week

Raising awareness of the national funding crisis was critical, and your voices helped make a difference. Your advocacy and donations ensured we could continue providing vital services in Thetford, despite funding cuts. We were visited by all four of our local Members of Parliament (MPs), and they helped us protest our local funding cut.



Win Stepped up: more beds, more care

In October, we increased our capacity to care, and your generosity has helped us maintain our specialist inpatient ward, which went from eight to 12 beds—ensuring more patients receive the expert, compassionate care they deserve.

Win Christmas Appeal: £80,000 raised!

Your kindness shone through once again! Our Christmas appeal raised an incredible £80,000, ensuring that more families received the care and comfort they needed during the festive season. Thank you.

Win Improved statutory funding position

Positive discussions with the Suffolk and North East Essex Integrated Care Board have resulted in an increase to our statutory funding, around 30%, which is now closer to, but still lower than, the average an England based adult hospice receives.



The increase announced by the Chancellor recently means we project a rise in our costs next year of around £160,000 just to cover this alone.



Opportunity £100m Government funding announced

The government's one-off pledge to support 170 adult hospices is welcome, but it cannot be used to fund our essential workforce, only infrastructure and IT projects. The government has released the first £25m of this funding, and we are pleased that we are set to benefit from an allocation of £97,852.



Major shift Assisted Dying Bill

While not directly linked to funding, the ongoing debate around legalising assisted dying is significant for hospices. We are following updates on the Bill's development, and continue to listen, engage with our partners and those we support to increase our understanding and prepare for its impact.

Telling the real, emotional stories of hospice care

Each year, hospice care supports over 300,000 people across the UK, but we rely on community support to continue our work.

have been creating toiletry bags filled with essentials to support families who wish to stay overnight.

Affectionately named Mollie's Minis, these bags provide toiletries so that loved ones don't need to leave to gather supplies. Last December, Heather visited the Hospice to deliver more than 20 bags, along with six cosy fleece blankets.

To mark our 40th year, Lavenham-based sculptor Kate Denton created for us a bespoke sculpture entitled Because You Matter. Kate and her husband, Anthony Faulkner, kindly gifted the sculpture to us, and it was auctioned off at a special gala held to celebrate the end of our 40 years of caring. Cycle ride raises over £200,000 in tribute to loved ones

In an inspiring show of determination and remembrance, 60 dedicated cyclists have raised an extraordinary £203,143.59 in honour of loved ones who died in a tragic event 50 years ago.

The Bury St Edmunds Rugby Club's 50th Anniversary Memorial Cycle Ride saw participants undertake a challenging 350-mile journey. The event commemorated those connected to the rugby club who were among the 346 people who died following the Turkish Airlines DC-10 disaster on March 3, 1974. The funds raised have been shared between the rugby club (£121,800) and the Hospice (£81,200).
